

For more than 30 years, Dr. Vicky Youcha has worked with young children, including those with brain injuries and their families. Her roles have included directing an early intervention program; working as a child development specialist; and supporting early childhood programs to include children with disabilities. Prior to coming to WETA, Youcha was the Executive Director of the Center for Alexandria's Children, a children's advocacy center. Dr. Youcha worked at ZERO TO THREE, the National Center for Infants, Toddlers and Families for almost nine years where she directed a leadership initiative and founded the Court Teams for Maltreated Infants and Toddlers Project. Prior to joining ZERO TO THREE, she taught at George Washington University and directed the Early Childhood Special Education Master's Degree Program at the Alexandria Graduate Education Center. She has authored a variety of publications related to abuse and neglect, inclusion, and disabilities. Her most recent book is *The ABCs of the ADA: Your Early Childhood Program's Guide to the Americans with Disabilities Act*.
